exam taken in pairs (or threes) (12 minutes per pair [16 per three] in total)

Part 1: Warm-up (3 minutes)

A few general questions concerning the students' life, general and academic interests.

Part 2: Individual long turns and follow-up questions (5 minutes)

Each students receives a topic (in the form of a question) together with two prompts (ideas) she/he may wish to talk about. After the individual long turn the other student asks 2 questions which the first student answers. The agenda for part 2 is as follows:

- (1) Student A's long turn (Student B listens) [1,5 minutes]
- (2) Student B asks 2 questions about what Student A has said (or generally about the topic), Student A responds and comments [1 minute]
- (3) Student B's long turn (Student A listens) [1,5 minutes]
- (4) Student A asks 2 questions about what Student B has said (or generally about the topic), Student B responds and comments [1 minute]

Part 3: Discussion (4 minutes)

Students receive two or three prompts related to the topic(s) of the previous stage and are specifically instructed to discuss the prompts **together**.
